WRITING DROP-IN LAB

Come write with us! Bring your own computer or work on one of ours—the Lab is a place for writing. Writing tutors, as well as other students, will be close by if you'd like help, clarification, assistance, or just someone off of whom to bounce ideas.

The Writing Drop-in Lab offers writing support for all UNM courses, as well as for application writing. The Spanish Writing Drop-in Lab, offered in collaboration with El Centro de la Raza, offers writing support for all UNM courses in which Spanish is the primary language of instruction. Working on a group project? The drop-in lab is a great place to hold your meetings.

WORKSHOPS AND CONVERSATION GROUPS

Every semester, the Writing & Language Center offers workshops on the following topics: Statements of Thesis, Prewriting, Organization, Incorporating Sources, and Revision. Additional topics related to writing and language are offered each semester as well. CAPS also offers language conversation groups, designed to give you practice speaking the language in a low-stakes, tutor-facilitated setting. Currently, groups are in place for Arabic, English (ESL), French, Italian, Japanese, Navajo, Portuguese, Russian, and Spanish.

INDIVIDUAL TUTORING

Interested in working with a tutor more intensively? You may schedule a 25- or 50-minute one-on-one appointment to meet with a writing or language tutor at Zimmerman library, from Monday until Friday.

Language · CAPS offers individual appointments for students enrolled in UNM courses in Arabic, Chinese, German, Greek, Latin, French, Italian, Japanese, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish, and Swahili. Language tutors can also work on writing in the target language.

ESL · ESL students can receive support related to mastering English as a language of speaking and writing in a university setting.

THE OWL AND ADDITIONAL ONLINE RESOURCES

The CAPS website offers a variety of online tutoring, learning, and academic resources, as well as options to submit papers in either English or Spanish to the Online Writing Lab (OWL). In the OWL, tutors read submissions and comment on a variety of writing issues, from organization and thesis statements to grammar and spelling. In the Virtual Tutoring Lab (VTL), writing tutors are available for live chat on issues related to writing.

What to expect in an appointment or lab session

The goal of all tutors in the Writing & Language Center is to provide you with tools that will enable you to work independently. In writing appointments and lab sessions, tutors will generally try to steer the discussion towards 'deeper' issues, such as organization, thesis, and argumentation instead of simply focusing on 'surface' issues, such as spelling and grammar. For language sessions, the focus is your on-going development towards fluency.

For an individual appointment, please come prepared with the assignment guidelines, any drafts or notes, and specific questions for the tutor. Expect to focus on one or two issues per session and no more than one writing assignment per session.

For the Writing Drop-In Lab, no preparation is necessary. Wherever you are in your project, come on in: CAPS tutors will be close by if you'd like some guidance.
